


3RD REGIONAL CONFERENCE ~REGION 6~ MAY 17TH-18TH, 2005

- ~Identify & promote integrated (ecological) approaches to remediation
- ~Promote community involvement/participation in ecological re-use design & site stewardship
- ~Evaluate the economics from natural approaches to remediation with or for the purpose of ecological re-use.
- ~Assess regulatory obstacles to ecological enhancements
- ~Develop approaches for obtaining constructive & meaningful stakeholder involvement
- ~Ensure sound scientific & technical support for ecological re-use practices
